It can be a full costume, or just a small part.



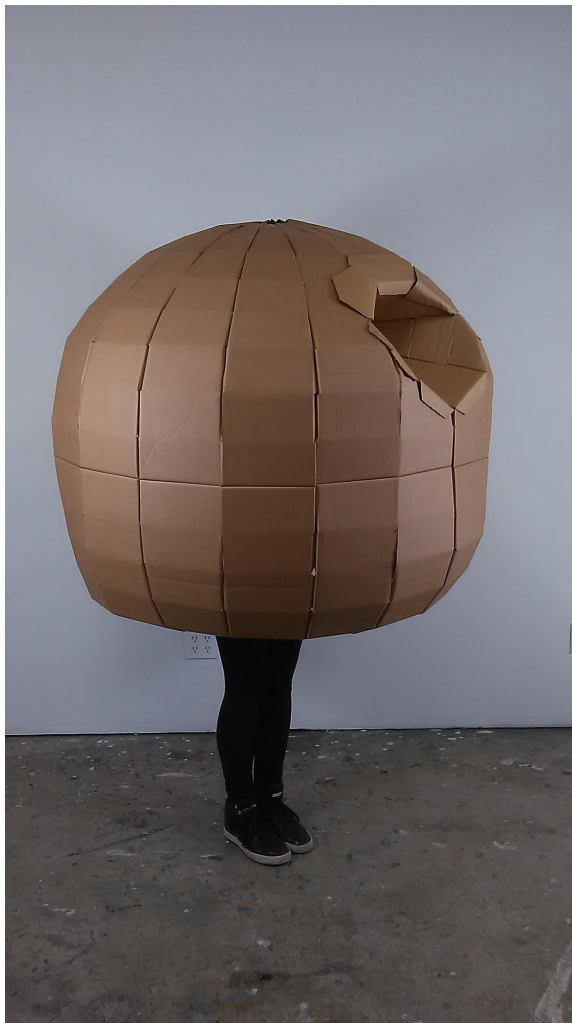


Inspired by Black Lives Matter
